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### Description of the discipline

The purpose of the discipline "International Migration Law" is a deep and thorough study by students of the basic principles of international legal regulation of migration processes; the ratio of legal regulation at the national and international levels, determining the legal status of migrants, refugees, stateless persons, bipatrids.

Upon completion of the discipline "International Migration Law", students are free to operate with special legal terminology in the field of international migration law, to know the basic provisions of international law; know the practice of application of international law, know the specifics of international organizations in the field of protection of migrants' rights and regulation of migration processes; to analyze the peculiarities of the formation and development of international legal regulation of migration processes at the universal level and to study the stages of formation of cooperation between states in relation to the regulation of migration processes.

### Evaluation policy
